Afterschool Programs Support Indiana Students

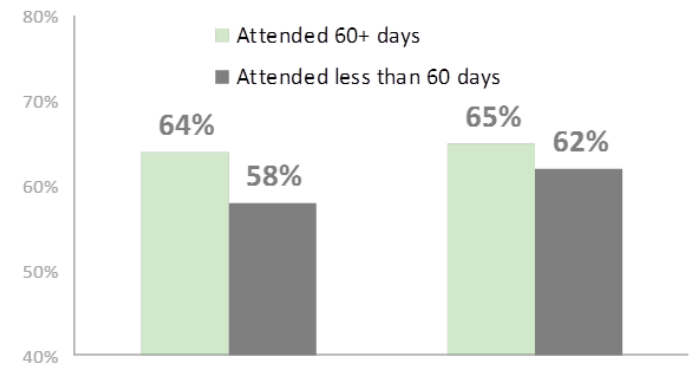
The federally-funded 21st Century Community Learning Centers (CCLC) initiative provides a safe environment during non-school hours for just over 20,000 Indiana students. Program sites are located in schools, community centers, and faith-based organizations. All programs provide a range of high-quality services to support academic and social development, including tutoring, mentoring, academic enrichment activities, service learning, character education, physical education and recreation.

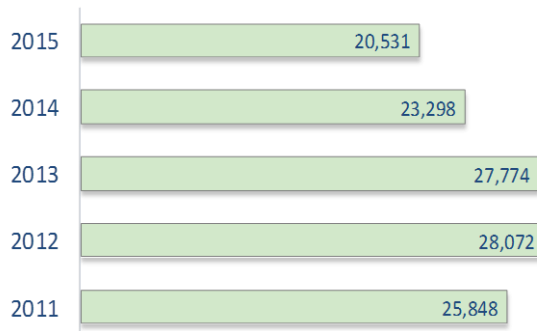
% of students who earned a "B" or higher or increased their grade from fall to spring, based on program attendance

Student Attendance and Academic Performance Gains:

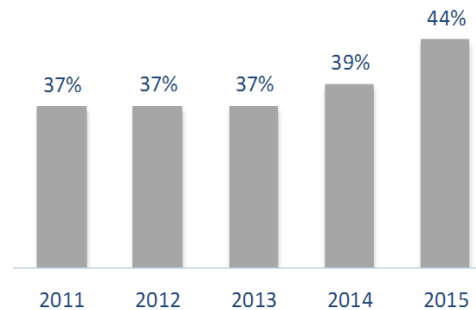
Despite a decrease in the total number of students served since 2013, 21st CCLC programs have increased the proportion of students served 60+ Days in the past two years. Research shows that students who attend high-quality afterschool programming at least 60-100 days per school year are more likely to improve their grades and classroom behaviors, and perform better on standardized tests compared to those who do not attend programs or attend them less frequently. Indiana's 21st CCLC after school program's focus on serving students 60+ days per school year.
