MILLION GIRLS MOONSHOT

REIMAGINE

An Initiative of the STEM Next Opportunity Fund

Launched in 2020, the Million Girls Moonshot is a national initiative to **develop an engineering mindset in one million more girls** through afterschool and summer learning by 2025.



MILLION GIRLS MOONSHOT

Million Girls Moonshot leverages the 50 State Afterschool Network to effectively and efficiently reach more girls.

It also shines a **national spotlight on girls in STEM, changing narratives** about who can be an engineer, a builder, an inventor, a leader.



MOONSHOT

Women remain significantly underrepresented in high-quality, highly paid STEM positions. They make up half the U.S. college educated workforce, but only 29% of the science and engineering workforce.

And of women STEM professionals, only 15% are in engineering – even less for women of color, with only 2% Latinx and 3% African American.



MILLION GIRLS MOONSHOT

STEM activities in afterschool and summer programs help kids build identity as an engineer and helps them stay engaged in further STEM learning.

Kids spend the majority of their time - 80% - learning in afterschool and summer settings.

> This is where we can reach more girls with STEM experiences nurturing interest, building skills, and changing narratives.

Regional Leadership Project Vision



- 1. Develop a network of Out-of-School Time (OST) programs that share a common framework for high quality STEM programming.
- high quality STEM programming.
 Increase access to high quality STEM programming for youth across Indiana.
- 3. Support the growth of regional networks with resources and professional development opportunities
- 4. Start with 6 Indiana regions this year, with one leader organization selected for each of 6 regions



Regional Leadership Project Vision



- 1. One Leader program per region will be selected for 6 of the Indiana regions indicated on the map.
- 2. If you are interested in becoming a Regional Leader, consider the opportunity shared in the rest of the presentation.
- 3. *If you are interested in joining your regional network as a participant or mentee, please indicate your interest and you will be matched with a Regional Leader. The regional networks are open to all Out-of-School Time programs that are interested in beginning, strengthening, or deepening STEM practices.



Benefits of Regional Leadership

- STIPEND to cover staff time and coverage, travel (\$750 per quarter, total of \$3000 with potential bonuses)

- Mentor regional OST programs that want to begin, grow, or deepen STEM practices
- Use INQPSA and Common Impact Suite tools to support programming and show impact
- Promote IAN and MGM resources within the region
- Attend cohort events in October and July (lunch provided)
- Attend training on PEAR Common Impact Suite tools
- Attend and participate in virtual Community of Practice meetings
- Participate in monthly community discussion board
- Attend the Indiana Summit on Out-of-School Learning and participate in STEM track sessions
- Keep track of activities in a provided Activity Tracker
